NORTHEAST FLORIDA FAIR ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Northeast Florida Fair Association is proud to offer two (2) \$1,000 scholarships to youth who have exhibited a desire to further their education. The purpose in offering these scholarships is to encourage growth, knowledge and assistance to students who qualify and plan to major in agriculture and other fields of study.

To be eligible a student must reside in one of the following counties in Florida: Nassau, Duval, Clay, Baker, or St. Johns. The applicant must be a high school senior, enrolled or planning to enroll in a junior college, university, or technical education. The applicant must have been involved in the Northeast Florida Fair for a minimum of two years.

On an attached page, answer in a one page essay, "What is the significance of the Northeast Florida Fair to you?" The applicant's essay should briefly discuss the youths background, lists of any awards or special recognition from the Northeast Florida Fair, community, high school, agricultural organizations (4- H, FFA, or other fairs). List any leadership experience with any of the above. The applicant must provide three (3) original letters of recommendation. Applications are available online, www.neflfair.org, and may be mailed or sent electronically. The Scholarship Committee will review only completed packets with the application, essay and original letters of recommendation. Applications, essays and letters of recommendation are due on September 1, 2024. The decision of the Committee is final. All applicants will be notified of the results prior to opening day of the Northeast Florida Fair. The scholarships will be presented at the Parade of Champions on Saturday, October 19, 2024, 4:00 p.m. Scholarship funds will be awarded directly to the winners.

NASSAU COUNTY FARM BUREAU'S YOUNG FARMER AND RANCHER AWARD

Nassau County Farm Bureau's Young Farmers and Ranchers will present an award during the 2024 Northeast Florida Fair. The "Young Farmer & Rancher Award" is to be presented during the Parade of Champions presentation.

Qualifications are as follows:

- •Must be an active member of 4-H and/or FFA in Nassau County.
- •Must be in the 12th Grade, a resident of Nassau County, and an exhibitor at the Northeast Florida Fair.
- •Must be nominated by someone such as a teacher, mentor, or group leader to qualify for the award.
- •A letter of recommendation must be received by the fair by September 1, 2024.
- •The Nassau County Farm Bureau's Young Farmers and Ranchers will

select the winner to be presented at the Parade of Champions on Saturday, October 19, 2024, 4:00 p.m.

•All nominations will be kept confidential until the award is presented.

YOUTH DECORATED EGG CONTEST

This contest is open to youth ages 5-18 as of day egg is delivered to the fair. There will be four age divisions. Entries must be pre-registered by submitting an entry form by September 1, 2024. Enter online at www.neflfair.org. Eggs must be delivered on Wednesday, October 9, 2024, to the Poultry Barn between 4:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.

Eggs must be removed from the fairgrounds on Saturday, October 19, 2024, after 10:00 p.m. (no drive-ins) or Sunday, October 20, 2024, from 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. No drive-ins after 11:30 a.m. The fair is not responsible for eggs left after this time.

- 1. Exhibitor is limited to one decorated egg entry.
- Decorated eggs must be the work of the exhibitor only and been done within the year.
- 3. Eggs must be real and have contents removed.
- 4. Eggs can be from a chicken, duck, goose, or turkey.
- 5. Egg may be decorated with paint, paper, crayons, markers, glitter, etc.
- Eggs must be decorated with designs suitable for the entire public. Eggs not deemed appropriate will be turned away at time of delivery.
- 7. The Modified Danish system will be used.
- 8. Decision of the judge will be final.
- 9. The fair takes no responsibility for loss or damage of eggs.

WHIP POPPING CONTEST

Chairperson: Jimmy Terrell Check-In: 1:00 p.m. Saturday, October 19, 2024 - 1:30 p.m.

- Pre-entries are encouraged online but will be accepted during check-in time on the day of the contest.
- 2. There will be five (5) Divisions: Pee Wee ages 5-7, Junior Division ages 8-10, Intermediate Division ages 11-13, Senior Division ages 14-18 (not graduated from high school), and Adult Division 18 and up.
- 3. Contestants MUST wear long pants and closed-toe shoes to compete.
- Pee Wee contestants will have 30 seconds to perform their whip cracking ability. Youth contestants in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Divisions will have 45 seconds and the Adult Division will have 60 seconds.
- 5. Whips can be from 6-14 feet long.
- 6. In the event of a tie, there will be a pop-off to determine the winner.
- 7. Judges will score on a scale of 1-10 (10 being the highest score) based on most original sharpness, loudness, and best overall performance.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Entries shall be restricted to youth 8 to 18 years of age, or youth still in

high school.

Youth entered in the Youth Beef, Youth Dairy, Youth Sheep or Market Shows are not required to be a 4-H or FFA member. Youth entered in 4-H and FFA Youth Poultry, Rabbit, or Goat Shows are required to be a 4-H or FFA member.

An exhibitor may have no more than 5 animals on the fairground premises at one time. This excludes open swine, poultry and rabbits.

All livestock must be displayed with a sign with the exhibitor's name, club or chapter, animal's breed and D.O.B. Animals without signs will not be judged for the Herdsman Award. No commercial farm signs can be 4. displayed in youth exhibits.

5. Entries for all animals closes September 1, 2024. Entries from outside of our five counties will be accepted on a space available basis. This does not

include market animals.

Animals must be in acceptable show condition.

The Modified Danish judging system will be used.
Additional premium money will not be paid on Grand and Reserve Grand Champions. Awards will be awarded.

All exhibitors must maintain their stall and pen space in a clean and sanitary manner. Animals must be clean and in the barn by opening of the fair, and remain in a clean condition until the close of the fair. All animal areas must be cleaned of shavings or hay when animals leave. This also applies to market animals that leave Sunday morning. If areas are not cleaned, \$20.00 will be deducted from the exhibitor's premium money, and

youth will not be allowed to show the following year.

10. No water will be left in beds by dairy and beef exhibitors. All pans will be picked up. Youth are responsible for feeding and watering their animals.

This rule excludes rabbits and poultry.

11. Bred by Exhibitor entries must be on entry form to qualify. If not registered on entry form, no ribbons or premiums will be awarded for this class. Animal must be registered. No leased animals are eligible for bred by

exhibitor.

12. Exhibitors are allowed two animals per class in all livestock except market

Misconduct or failure to cooperate with the show management by the exhibitor, parents or other exhibitors will be reviewed by the Livestock Committee immediately and may result in the exhibitor being disqualified from the show.

14. It is mandatory that all exhibitors entering the show ring wear a buttoned down collared shirt with at least 3/4 sleeves, dark blue or black jeans or trousers worn at the waist. Closed toed shoes, no sneakers or flip flops.

No hats or baseball caps in the show ring. 4-H and FFA attire is strongly recommended. There will be no commercial advertising on the clothing. Exhibitors who do not adhere to this rule will not be allowed in the show ring. This rule also applies to the Parade of Champions and Market Sale for youth that showed animals. Chapter or club advisors may require 4-H and FFA official dress and will take precedence over the above.

15. No writing or foreign objects (except leads and halters) on animals when

showing or selling.

No sleeping or overnight staying in the barns unless approved by the livestock committee.

Exhibitor and animals need to be prompt when called into the show ring for

show or market sale. If the exhibitor is late, they will be moved to the end of the sale.

Separation of individual Animals by a physical barrier in a manner that assures one Animal does not have access to the body, excrement, or discharges of another Animal; does not share a building with a common ventilation system; and is not within ten feet of another Animal.

NATIONAL SHEEP AND GOAT SCRAPIE ERADICTION PROGRAM

Effective July 1, 2005

Requirements for identification of Sheep and Goats in Shows, Exhibitions, and Fairs

This information is presented to clarify the mandatory identification requirements for sheep and goats under the National Scrapie Eradication Program. There are two components of the identification requirements that must be met before sheep and goats are allowed to move into the state or within Florida (intrastate) for shows, exhibitions, or fairs.

- 1. **Premises identification** Before official individual animal identification tags can be issued, the owner/agent must register the premises on which the animal is located and obtain a premises identification number from USDA.
- 2. Individual animal identification Once the premises are registered, the owner/agent will receive official individual animal identification tags for identifying each sheep and goat. Applicator pliers will be provided to FFA, 4-H leaders and/or fair/livestock/show committee for assisting exhibitors of the official are tags.

The premises must be registered before the exhibitor can receive the official individual ear tag for each animal. The official tags must be applied to the exhibitor's animals prior to presenting them for exhibition. Official ear tags must be affixed by FFA, 4-H leaders or by a representative of the Livestock Show committee or veterinarian.

THE NORTHEAST FLORIDA AGRICULTURE FAIR SUPPORTS

THE NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more then avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners exhibitors fifters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and livestock in competitive events:

- All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible

person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in any event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other then in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance had been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns or ahimals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal is prohibited.

The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

6. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

7. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violates this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooper- ate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

8. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's con- dition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

10. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.
